

Post-conference report

The G-I-N conference participation support grant provided me with an invaluable opportunity to continue and expand further work on the development of clinical guidelines, their adaptation, and implementation in my country. In particular, considering the limited resources and existing barriers in low and middle-income countries (LMICs), it contributes to more effective work towards providing quality medical care on the evidence-based medicine.

An important part of the annual meeting is the exchange of experience with colleagues from other countries, discussion of achievements and modern innovations in this area, and also overcoming of current problems. Especially interesting in the diverse experience of Asian countries.

It should be noted that Ukraine has its own experience in synthesizing clinical guidelines through a combination of several clinical guidelines from different developers. It is very important to critically evaluate and compare several documents.

Participation in the conference allows communicating with like-minded people and adherents of evidence-based medicine, to collaborate with other organizations and to disseminate knowledge both among healthcare providers and other stakeholders.

Integrating digital platforms is of utmost interest for LMICs, as it reduces the duplication of information and reduces the cost of the healthcare system, as well as improves the efficiency of work in general.

To date, Registry of medical technological documents as an information resource has been created in Ukraine. This database contains current orders, clinical protocols, clinical guidelines, medical care standards. Its content is regularly updated. Easy navigation and search across the content of the website make it a useful tool for providing information support for users. Transparency at all stages of medical documents development improves the confidence of professionals and the public in new documents. In addition, there is an opportunity to ensure the effective interaction of the website with other information resources and support of feedback channels.

We look forward to output guidance in support of evidence-based medicine at all levels of decision-making and development of healthcare system for LMICs!
