Increasing need of healthcare as a result of

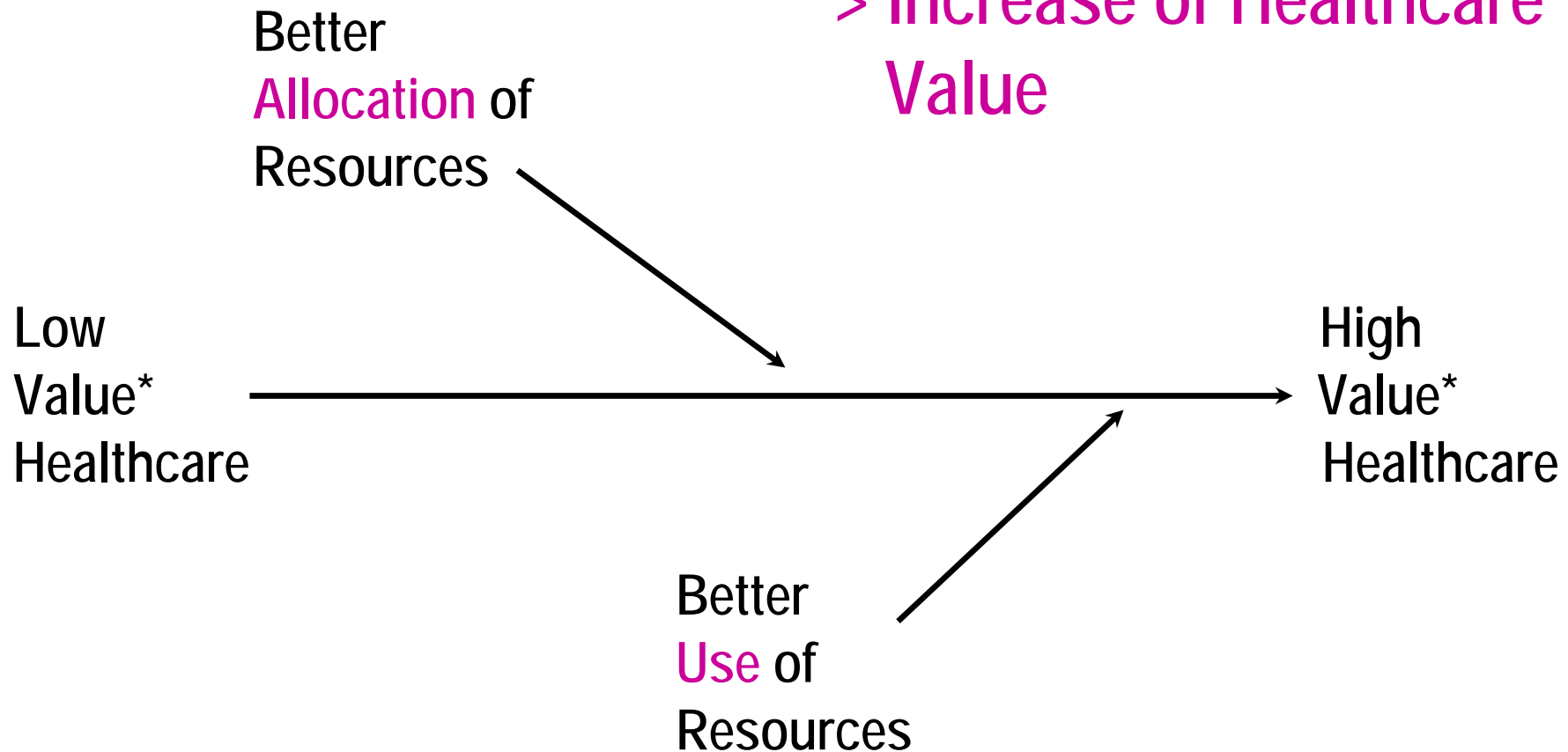
1. Population ageing

- > Increase of Healthcare Value



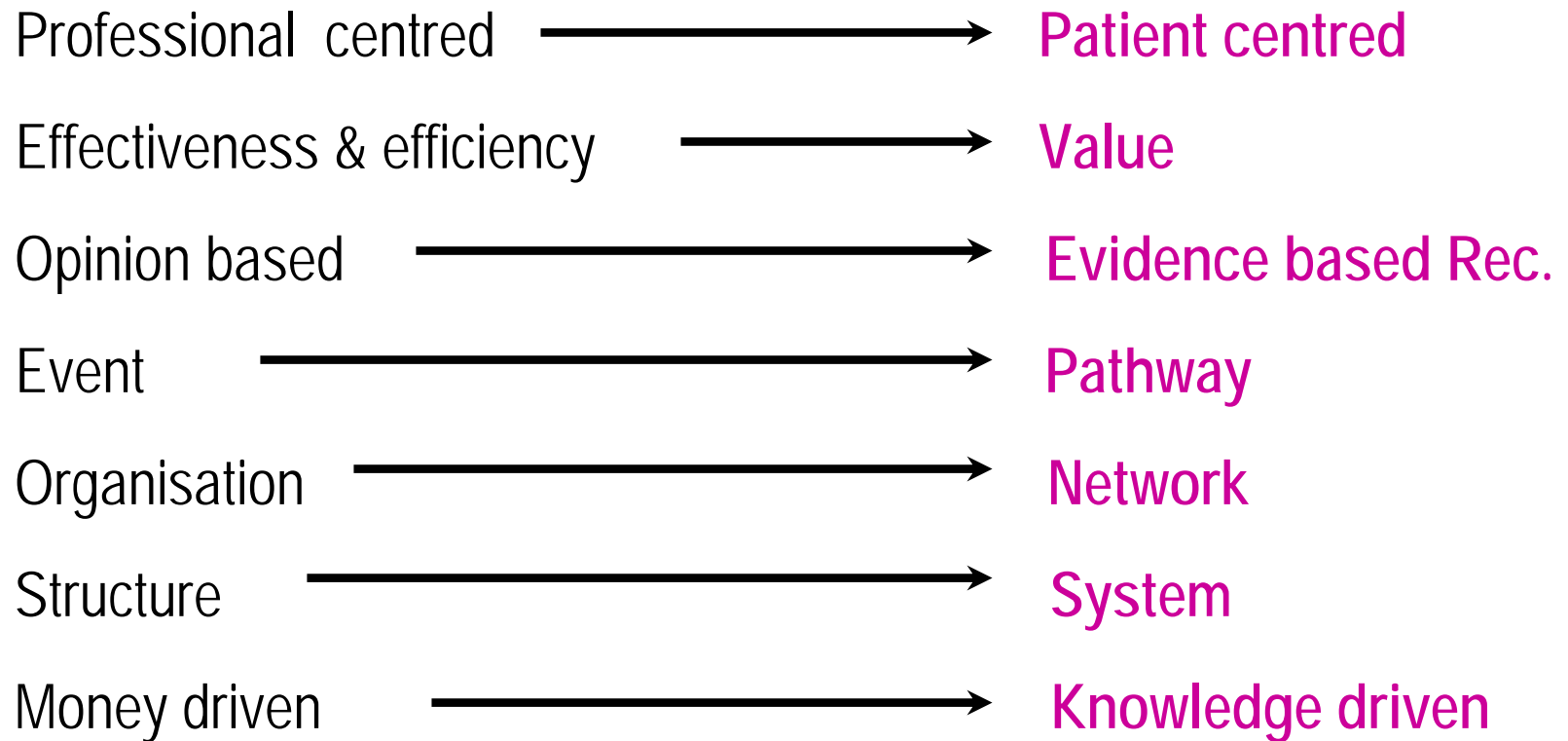
* The *value of the resources invested in healthcare* is maximised when no more benefit and no less harm can be obtained by *ALLOCATING* or *USING* resources in any other way
