**POSITIONS / AFFILIATIONS**

- Research funded Associate Professor, University of Adelaide, Australia; I am also the Postgraduate Coordinator for Ph.D and research masters programs.
- Currently Acting Executive Director, the Joanna Briggs Institute (JBI), my substantive position is Director, Implementation Science in which I am responsible for the JBI tools and resources to facilitate implementation of best practice in clinical practice settings.
- I have an Adjunct Associate Professorship at Queens University, School of Nursing, Kingston, Ontario, Canada for my work on CAN-Implement a process for the adaptation and implementation of existing guidelines and evidence in to localised guidelines that embed implementation planning and evaluation from the inception of the project.
- Within the Cochrane Collaboration, I am a member of the Fields executive and the working party on Knowledge Translation which is a project to realign the Cochrane Collaboration organisationally to a knowledge translation mode of activity.

**RELEVANT EXPERTISE and EXPERIENCE**

The NHMRC is Australia's Federal Agency for health and health services research funding. It also includes a guideline portal to which Australian Guideline development groups may submit copy of their CPG's. I was a member of the portal development group that provided recommendations for the structure and function of the portal, including the minimum reporting requirements for guideline submissions to the portal. JBI was a founding member of G-I-N, and I have had varied levels of involvement since working with Dr Günter Ollenschläger on a workshop for the Lyon meeting in 2005. Most recently I was an invited plenary for the 2015 Amsterdam meeting where I also ran a workshop with Professor Margaret Harrison (original ADAPTE working group member) on CAN-Implement. For the last 3 years I have worked with Prof Margaret Harrison on developing an online web-based software platform for guideline implementation. Called CAN-Implement.Pro this open access software incorporates the learning outcomes from a 5-year multi-site funded evaluation program on the contextual and facilitatory factors associated with guideline implementation. In 2016 I authored 2 scholarly publications on implementation planning and facilitation in guideline adaptation with Prof Harrison.

**GOALS and PLANS for the IWG**

1. Continuity is important, I would like to continue with the work established by Dr Anna Gagliardi on tools and checklists to facilitate implementation and the proposed survey of physicians on barriers to implementation, however, **I would like to expand (or modify and repeat) this as a multi disciplinary survey** should the IWG agree to this.
2. Additionally, methods analysis for common barriers and facilitators to implementation identified in available published implementation studies would provide useful contextual analysis of what works for guideline implementation.
3. I have ethical approval for a series of studies related to user perspectives and feasibility studies on guideline adaptation and implementation planning, and am keen to support the knowledge generation aims of the IWG.
